Through this darkness we must fight

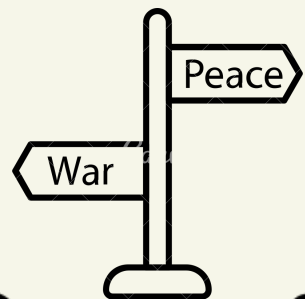

But was Dying due to violation.

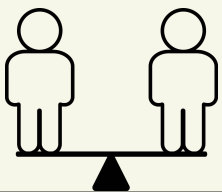

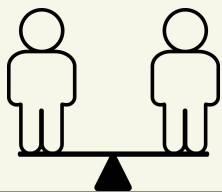

As tyrants reign, their power unchecked, you know.

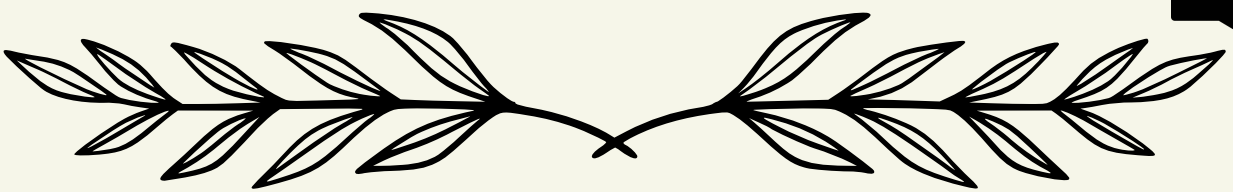
But fear not, for hope still burns like a flame,

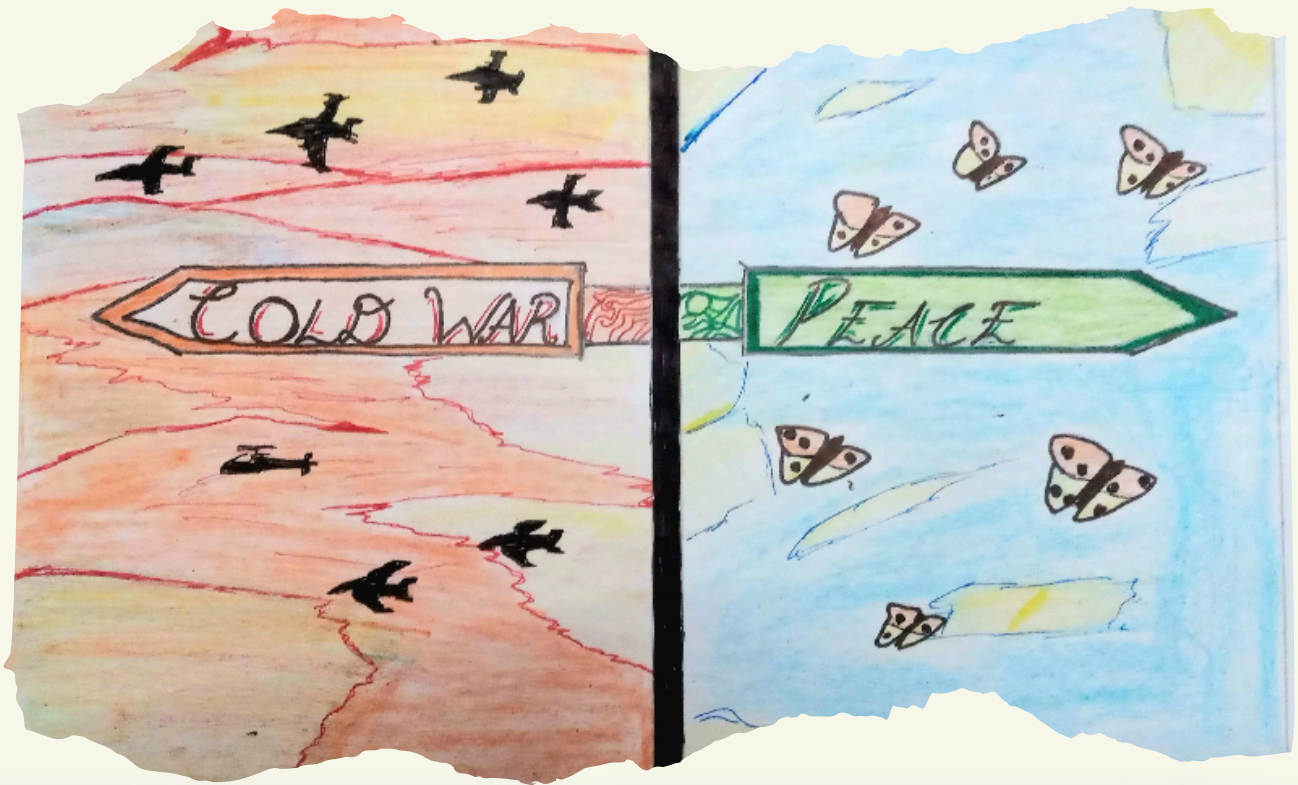

FOUNDER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

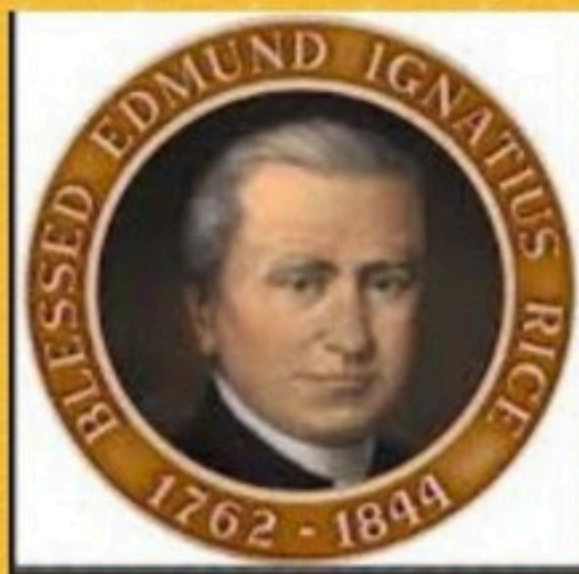

LABOUR DAY CELEBRATIONS



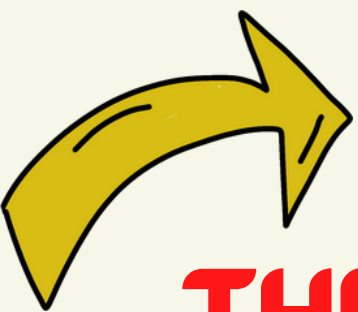
