

THE SPIRIT AT ST. COLUMBA'S

Human Beings are not born equal. However, each human being is born unique. Each one has the right and potential to shine. The whole of Life, but especially the family and education in early life are fundamental environments in which each human being both discovers and gets the initial feel of one's innate potential.

The modern age, modern psychology and current sociological thought have all concurred that it is in inclusivity and not exclusivity which is the best nurturing environment during the initial key years of a human being's life.

We have multiple intelligences and that all of us, to reach our potential, must have the experience of growing in ALL our multiple intelligences, while discovering the ones which are our strengths and having reasonable expectations of those which are not our strengths. However, the development of one to the negation of others leads to the development of warped personalities, possibly eccentric and anti-social persons and thus basically sad human beings – which is not the purpose of any school and definitely not a school like St. Columba's.

Thus St. Columba's chooses to be a school with an inclusive environment.

It is our challenge, in this environment, to help each individual discover and grow to their potential.

We understand that all the children are not expected to and it is not desirable that all only shine in one area of excellence. Some will have better sporting capabilities than others, others will have better theatrical abilities (like Shahrukh Khan – our past pupil); others will have greater entrepreneurial skills like (the founder of Naukri.com – again, our past pupil).

This fundamental truth was understood by Edmund Rice, the founder of the Christian Brothers as far back in 1802! Edmund was a very successful businessman when most of his fellow Irish men were wallowing in poverty. He did not come to success because he was born to privilege – far from it – he was as disenfranchised as the rest of his countrymen, brutalized by vengeful English Lords. Having reached success the tough way, He chose to take kids from the most miserable backgrounds and give them both the means to live respectful lives (e.g., one of his success stories was transforming a stow away young Italian Iad – Bianconni – and set him up in business – Bianconni, even in Edmund's life time, gained wealth far in excess of any wealth Edmund had, yet his hallmark, like Edmund, was care for the less fortunate) and to be compassionate people.

Therefore, Edmund Rice schools, and thus, St Columba's as an Edmund Rice Educational Institution, has always endeavored to welcome students from all backgrounds and with various abilities or so called 'disabilities' what we now term 'differently abled persons', to the school. The hallmark of St Columba's, and this will be attested to by all Columbans, is that the background or the economic wellbeing or deprivation of a fellow Columban does not matter, in fact, it has never been a factor in relationships. Columbans who are challenged physically draw forth from their peers the most generous support and concern.

Creating a High Potential school has not meant for us, St. Columba's, being in a rarefied environment. We struggle to stay shoulder to shoulder with our students as they discover who they are – the discovery is, at the end, an experience of ecstasy but the journey is generally one through which their strengths of character are developed. Being an inclusive school will mean that we mirror our society: we have full classrooms; we have to struggle to find the finance to create empowering infrastructure, open new courses and to maintain the same.

Through it all our students come forth as self-aware, self-assured, socially conscious and mindful of their innate divinity, humane human beings who have what it takes to shine in life – and that surely is THE HIGHEST POTENTIAL. It is in this sense that we are a high potential school – and we dare anyone to nay our claim. This is not often seen while in school (though there are many wonderful stories from parents and young people of how they have bloomed) or even at the time of the student's graduation, or at the time of their CBSE Class X or XII results, but when they leave school and suddenly realize the privileged place which was their alma mater – St. Columba's!

Edmund, the Extraordinary

A brief historical sketch Of Edmund Rice our saintly founder



Edmund Rice was born in Callan, Co. Kilkenny, Ireland in 1762. Ireland was occupied by the English and poverty and religious discrimination abounded. Edmund belonged to a tenant farming family. After completing his commercial education, he worked with his uncle in establishing a very lucrative ship chandler's business, one of the few occupations open to people like him. In 1785, he married Mary Elliot, the daughter of a prosperous Waterford businessman. In 1789, tragedy struck when his wife died. Edmund was now left alone to care for a daughter with special needs.

In 1800 Edmund sold his elegant house and moved into a stable to open his first school in Waterford. His first two companions were Thomas Grosvenor and Patrick Finn who joined him in 1802. The first monastery that Edmund built was called Mount Sion and this is where he died and is now buried.

Initially Edmund's Brothers were known as the Presentation Brothers. The Congregation of Christian Brothers was formally founded in 1820 with Edmund Rice as the first Superior General. In 1825, the first school outside Ireland was started in Preston, England. In 1838 Edmund Rice resigned as Superior General. In 1841 he fell ill and died on 29th August 1844. The Calcutta Brothers came into existence in 1845 – a Religious Brotherhood under the authority of the Archbishop of Calcutta. The first 2 Calcutta Brothers were Irish men, trained by the Christian Brothers in Ireland. In 1895, the Calcutta Brothers amalgamated with the Christian Brothers.

Today there are about 800 Christian Brothers in 28 countries all over the world. Edmund was beatified on 6th October, 1996. The Christian Brother community has initiated a process to raise him to the altars although he has already been canonized in the hearts of those who have experienced his charismatic presence through his band of dedicated men. The Christian Brothers ministry is the Christian Education of youth. This ministry is carried out in many formal schools, flexi schools, non-formal programmes and community projects.

The Congregation invites Catholic men who feel drawn to a life of 'Religious' commitment, the community life and ministry of the Christian Brothers to contact any Christian Brother and share this interest. If the great Congregation founded by Edmund Rice is to live on, we need generous and idealistic young men to join it.

Yet, the charism (special gift of the Holy Spirit) given to Edmund and his Brothers, is not only for men called to a life of Religious commitment. The Holy Spirit blesses all, who through God's providence come into contact with Edmund's Brothers with the charism – teachers, students, etc. The Brothers invite all so gifted, to join in nurturing the charism and strengthening the ministry.





SOCIAL JUSTICE EDUCATION & COMMUNITY OUTREACH 2023-24

Social Justice Education & Community Outreach is an integral part of our school academic program. It aims to form the minds and hearts of our students so that they grow into responsible citizens with a heart for those who are underprivileged and on the edges of our society. Our objective is to nurture a spirit of selfless love, undying peace, ceaseless gratitude, and deep compassion in our students. We seek to form them into young men who will live a life of virtue, goodness, and integrity.

Our Social Justice Education curriculum has evolved largely from the 17 Sustainable Development Goals formulated by the United Nations. Hence, we carefully plan our Social Justice curriculum every year around national and global issues that need our urgent attention and action. Themes like Climate Change, Gender Equality, Sustainable Living, and Ending Poverty have been our focus over the past few years. **Embedding Justice in the Curriculum** – which means linking elements of Social Justice and Human/Earth Rights Education into all our academic subjects/topics and school programmes – has been our theme since 2020 and in this academic year as well we will work in the same direction. The objective is that the entire school ethos is one of openness, inclusion, sensitivity, and awareness of the rights and dignity of each living being, especially of the less privileged and oppressed, and care for our planet.

Community Outreach is a key feature of the Social Justice Education Programme. Our school collaborates with various NGOs and we try to reach out to as many as possible who can benefit from our care and assistance. Last year we collaborated with groups that work in ration collections, food distribution, care for the elderly and persons with disabilities, and E-waste recycling. We also have a Justice Education Society, a Justice News Desk, and an Eco-Club so that our students can learn how to become conscious and aware citizens of the world through creative writing, journalism, interactive sessions, competitions, workshops, and other such mediums. Our school community has last year collaborated with other schools, especially of the Edmund Rice Network (both nationally and internationally), and various other stakeholders to create a more diverse and vibrant learning experience for our students. We also have volunteering opportunities and research-based projects so that they learn how to be responsible and conscientious participants/leaders in the fields of ecological activism, advocacy, and social service.

At SCS, more than just 'giving' (which in itself is noble), the school will attempt to foster a critical mindset in our students so that they learn to question oppressive structures and work for the transformation of our society. Our aim will always be that our students be made aware of the 'cry of the poor' and the 'cry of the earth'. We aim to raise their sensitivity and knowledge on the rights and dignity of all beings and the Earth, our Common Home, so that they develop a sense of brotherhood and altruism in their life choices. It is our prayer that like our Founder, Blessed Edmund Rice, we may live a life of generous selfgiving and relentless courage so that we may be ever faithful in our service to the world and all of God's creation.

SAFETY AT SCHOOL

I. DISASTER MANGEMENT

The school has taken the following steps towards disaster management:

- a) Emergency numbers are displayed on all the corridors of the Junior, Middle and Senior Section buildings.
- b) A safe and effective evacuation plan has been created for emergency conditions like fire, earthquake etc.
- c) Fire extinguishers and firefighting equipment have been installed on all the floors of the three buildings.
- d) Effective alarms are fitted in the offices of the three section heads.
- e) A daily headcount is done in all the classes.
- f) All visitors are issued passes to mark and authorize their entry.

- g) All students and staff in the School have an ID card with their relevant details.
- h) Regular upkeep and maintenance of fire safety equipment and conduct of mock drills for evacuation to check and enhance the safety preparedness of the school are done.

The Protection Officer is a member of a Centre of Activity appointed to ensure that all protective measures for safeguarding children are in place and implemented. Any kind of child abuse – bullying, physical, sexual, emotional must be reported to the Protection Officer by anyone who observes or witnesses it.



Administrative

Information

ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

- 1. The Principal reserves for himself the right to refuse admission to any boy without having to furnish a reason.
- 2. Formal admission is complete only after the application has been considered by the Principal, the parent informed of his decision and the admission card is signed by the Principal.
- 3. No pupil will be admitted to the school without a transfer certificate from the last school which he attended.
- 4. For the withdrawal of a pupil from the School, a calendar months' notice must be given in writing, otherwise a calendar month's fees will be charged. A full year's fees shall however be charged for any withdrawal that occurs after 120 days of the commencement of the academic year.
- 5. A student must be withdrawn from the school if he does not pass the class in 2 years.
- 6. Transfer Certificate can be obtained only after all the dues have been paid. Duplicate copies of Transfer Certificate are ordinarily not issued. In special cases such certificates will be issued after verification, on payment of Rs. 500/-.
- 7. A duplicate copy of the report card can be obtained on payment of Rs. 500/-.
- 8. Duplicate transcripts will only be made available to a student if a photocopy of the original is attached and on payment of Rs. 500/-.
- 9. Students whose fees have not been cleared will not have their names included in the class list the following year.
- 10. Students who remain absent without prior sanction for TWO consecutive School weeks shall be struck off the rolls without explanation.
- 11. Parents MUST inform the school in writing regarding any absence beyond 2 days. However, every absence must be noted and signed by Parents on the assigned page in the diary.
- 12. If a student is re-admitted, a re-admission fee has to be paid.

CURRICULUM, EXAMINATIONS AND PROMOTIONS

- 1. Students are prepared for the Central Board of Secondary Education Examination, Classes- X & XII.
- Regular assessments are a feature. Attendance for these is compulsory. The final results are declared on the cumulative marks obtained throughout the year. Hence, attendance for all tests and exams is essential. If the management deems that extra classes are required, then students will be expected to stay back / attend these classes.
- 3. The pass mark and promotion criterion will be as per CBSE norms.
- 4. If the student is unwell, he should stay at home.
- 5. A student who uses unfair means during an assessment, will be given zero marks for that subject, and UM (Unfair Means) will be noted in the report card. Repetition of the same will result in stern action.
- 6. All fees due are to be paid before the commencement of the exams.
- 7. Students whose session fees have not been cleared will not have their names included in the classlist in the following session.
- 8. A duplicate copy of the report card can be obtained on payment of Rs.500/-
- 9. Duplicate transcripts will only be made available to a student if a photocopy of the original is attached and on payment of Rs. 500/-

Junior Section

The students in the Junior Section are given 'grades' in the Report Card based on the work done in class (class responses, neatness in the work, maintenance of exercise books, participation in class discussions and activities) and regular class/ term assessments. A holistic remark is given on the progress of each child in every term.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PUPILS

- 1. Students are not permitted to use the school telephone except in urgent cases and with permission.
- 2. While changing classrooms between periods, pupils should move in silence and in an orderly and disciplined manner in a line with hands behind their backs.
- 3. All items belonging to the student must have his full name, current class and section.
- 4. The school is not responsible for goods or money lost. Students are requested not to wear expensive watches. Money should not be borrowed, lent or articles of any nature exchanged for cash or kind.
- 5. When the school is in session, the students are strictly forbidden to leave the class without an Out-pass or the school premises without a Gate-pass.
- 6. During recess and at the assembly no student is to remain in the classroom.
- 7. Mobile phones are NOT allowed for students in school.
- 8. Magazines, books and other print / digital material, not part of the book-list , should only be brought to school with the written permission of a teacher/Head. Written permission for this must be with the student.
- 9. We believe our boys are gentlemen and so we discourage abusive language which offers disrespect to anyone. Derogatory remarks pertaining to one's appearance, culture, religion etc., are frowned upon and stern action will be taken if there is an infringement of this rule.
- 10. Any expensive item brought to school will be confiscated and returned only at the end of the term.
- 11. The management views with grave concern the consumption of alcohol or substance abuse of any sort and seeks the active cooperation of parents.
- 12. Each child is under our care and protection. We attempt to see that violence is not done either to or by him. Bullying and ragging will not be condoned.
- 13. St. Columba's is an English medium school. Thus, all instruction is given in English. Students are to converse in English while in school. Parents are requested to impress upon their children the importance of this and to ensure that English is one of the languages of communication at home.
- 14. The student's identity card must be worn at all times in school.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1. The Management, acting through the Principal, reserves the right to resigning the charge of any pupil, who is deemed unsatisfactory. In such cases the Principal is not bound to give any reason.
- 2. Latecomers and absentees must enter their late-for-school record in the diary, to be signed by the teachers and parents respectively.
- 3. Any leave taken must be formally asked for, by the parents.
- 4. In case of long leave, prior written permission of the Principal must be obtained. In case of illness, (for more than three days) a medical certificate must be submitted within three days of absence.
- 5. Pupils are strictly forbidden to leave the school premises during the regular school hours. Permission to do so may be granted only by the Principal/Administrator and the respective Headmistress.
- 6. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, neglect of homework, disobedience and disrespect towards the members of the School Staff will be dealt with severely.
- Attendance is compulsory on the first day of a new academic session and on the day before and the day after the summer/winter break (for each academic year). Attendance is also compulsory before and after Dussehra / Diwali / Christmas / Easter break.
- 8. Attendance, adding to 75% of the total number of working days, is compulsory for students.
- 9. Teachers in this school are not permitted to give private tuitions to the pupils from their own classes.
- 10. Pupils who are accompanied by attendants should never leave school alone. In case of a delay, they should report to the school office. Pupils must be picked up punctually after school timings for dispersal.
- 11. Parents and guardians are not allowed to visit their wards or teachers in the classroom without the permission of the Principal/Administrator or the respective Headmistress.
- 12. Pupils must understand that a school is judged by the discipline and conduct of its students. They should always be polite and courteous to each other, to their teachers and elders and treat the helpers with respect.
- 13. Any kind of damage done to the school premises must be made good and will be viewed seriously by the authorities.
- 14. Any damage to hardware or software of a computer allocated to a student must be made good. If repeated, the student will not be permitted to use the computer.
- 15.No PARKING is permitted on the pavement just outside the school, nor between the parked vehicles.
- 16. The stipulated uniform must be worn smartly by students under all circumstances.

NON - ACADEMIC

- 1. Provision is made for games, sports, athletics and swimming.
- 2. Swimming facilities are provided for certain classes during school hours. In such cases, each boy in the class is expected to take part for his own health and well-being.
- 3. Pupils must attend games and other activities outside school hours when required to do so and participation in such circumstances will be deemed compulsory by the school authorities. Exemption may be granted on a written request from parents. Such exemption should not be lightly sought as games play an important part in the student's all-round education.

TRANSPORT RULES

- 1. All students should obey the respective staff/guard/monitors, the driver and conductor of their mode of transport. Silence and calm must prevail when coming to school each morning. You may catch up on sleep, prayer or study.
- 2. The staff/guard/monitor should check the entry of a new person in his/her vehicle.
- 3. Any quarrel/fight and dispute, should be reported to the vehicle in-charge at the earliest. It is imperative that a certain decorum be maintained in the vehicle at all times.
- 4. In case of any mishaps in the vehicle, please call 100 and inform the school office immediately. (23363134, 23363462).
- 5. Misbehaviour in the vehicle, violence in school, participation in groups and damage to property these are considered major disciplinary violations. Reports of violence in any form in or out of the school shall result in the rustication of the pupil/s concerned.
- 6. "Safety saves" so avoid travelling on footboards and any unnecessary movement in the vehicle. Heads, Elbows, Arms, etc., should not be sticking out of windows. Do not throw things from your vehicle into passing vehicles. It is not funny, it is rude and you could be fined.
- 7. Travel with the permission of the concerned authority in the vehicle.
- 8. Do not get on/off the vehicle while it's moving, or at the signals/crossings, etc.
- 9. Use of foul language and carrying objectionable material are punishable offences, as is bullying of smaller and vulnerable individuals.

A STUDENT'S RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Right: I have the right to be happy at St. Columba's and to be treated with understanding.
- Responsibility: It is my responsibility to respect the rights of others. It is my responsibility to treat others with understanding, not to laugh at others, tease them or try to hurt their feelings.

✓ Right: I have a right to be treated respectfully and fairly.

Responsibility: It is my responsibility to treat others with respect. It is my responsibility to accept the authority of school staff. It is my responsibility to be truthful and treat others fairly.

✓ Right: I have a right to be safe.

Responsibility: It is my responsibility not to do anything which may threaten or cause danger to myself and others. It is my responsibility to tell teachers if there is any danger around my classroom or in the school environment.

Right: I have a right to expect my property to be safe.

Responsibility: It is my responsibility not to steal, damage or destroy the property of others. It is my responsibility to take proper care of school property.

Right: I have a right to a good education at school.

Responsibility: It is my responsibility to be well behaved in class and to create a class atmosphere which facilitates teaching-learning. It is my responsibility to keep up-to-date with work in class and homework, to attempt every assessment task and to attend school regularly and punctually.

Right: I have a right to be protected against threats to my health.

- Responsibility: It is my responsibility as a member of the school, not to smoke, take alcoholic drinks or drugs or influence other students to do so, either at school, or while traveling to or from school or at any other event organized by the school.
- Right: I have a right to have a pleasant, clean and well-maintained school and environment.
- Responsibility: It is my responsibility to care for the school environment to keep it neat and clean, free of litter.

Right: I have the right to benefit from the good name of the school

Responsibility: It is my responsibility to behave in such a manner that society will respect the good name of the school.

Right: I have a right to make decisions for myself

Responsibility: It is my responsibility to make sensible decisions and to face the consequences of my decisions, actions or lack of action.

EXPECTATIONS FROM PUPILS

1. Our School Community expects that you will...

- show pride in your school and present a good image especially by behaving yourself when in public and particularly on your way to and from school.
- display your school spirit by participating in school activities enthusiastically and not sitting at home on a Saturday school day.
- make the necessary arrangements to stay back after school hours to participate in academic, sports and cocurricular activities whenever required.
- respect school property and report immediately any damage to school property that you observe being done. This is not sneaking.
- not bring objectionable books, magazines or periodicals to the school. i pods and other electronic gadgets are also prohibited.
- not use unfair means during tests. Such improper conduct is unworthy of a Columban and can lead to severe penalties. Cheating teaches nothing, Ultimately, you are the loser.

2. Your Teachers expect that you will...

- show them and your fellow-students courtesy and respect at all times.
- come to class on time and bring all necessary materials with you.
- complete assignments carefully and on time.
- put your hand up show your name- write large on the second last page of your copy book or display your name card to ask / answer questions: do not **blurt** out of turn.

3. The Members of the School community, especially your fellow students, expect that you will...

- not interfere with their person by bullying or violence or use of foul language and discourage others who do so.
- be responsible for your actions and accept the consequences.

EXPECTATIONS FROM PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. The School expects that you will...

- □ be available, if it is necessary, to discuss aspects of your child's behaviour at school. His discipline record is in this book. Tearing out papers; losing the physical diary will not be condoned.
- sign messages, circulars, progress reports or other similar documents when requested to do so, to avoid putting your child through any inconvenience.
- **u** check the school diary / eCare App daily as it forms a link between the school and the parents.
- ensure that your son is not absent on the first or last day of the school term without prior permission.
- be responsible to give a comprehensive medical report of any ailment / allergy /condition of the child which needs the school's special attention.
- come to pick up your child if called to school for any medical emergency.
- Check your son's bag before leaving for schools to ensure that no dangerous or objectionable material is brought to school.
- □ make sure the child is sensitized towards COVID protocols.

2. The teaching staff expects that you will...

- □ feel free to contact an individual teacher during his/her free periods by taking prior permission from the Principal/Administrator and the respective Headmistress if you wish to discuss a matter of concern to you or your child.
- be open to listening to the teacher's opinion regarding your child's behaviour or performance even when the observations are less than complimentary.

3. Other parents expect that you will...

- exert firm parental discipline in cases where your child's behaviour is distracting others from the quality of learning opportunities for others in the class.
- □ strongly discourage your boy from displaying aggression towards other children irrespective of any provocation.
- keep your child at home if he is suffering from contagious diseases like mumps, measles, chicken- pox, whooping cough, conjunctivitis, H1N1, viral fever, COVID-19, etc. The child is to be sent to school only with a doctor's fitness certificate.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE PARENTS

- 1. Parents are requested to remain regularly in touch with the day-to- day studies of the child and also keep in contact with the school through the school diary.
- 2. Private tuitions are strongly discouraged. It is important that a child develops the habit of working and studying on his own under the guidance of parents.
- 3. Parents are requested to check the school diary daily and take note of and sign the remarks made in the diary.
- 4. Parents should make it a point to attend the Parent-Teacher Meeting on the given date. The school administration will take a serious view of parents regularly absenting themselves from such meetings.
- 5. In all official correspondence with the school, the full name of the child, registration number as well as the class and roll number should be stated.
- 6. All circulars sent must be read and acted upon.
- 7. Kindly ensure that your child packs his school diary/books/note books/pen/pencil box as per the timetable for school every day to avoid being overloaded. No child should carry more than 2-3 Kgs in his bag.
- 8. Saturday school, when so stated, is a working day and you cannot keep your child at home and expect to make up the loss.
- 9. Parents are not permitted to make video recordings of any proceedings in school or outside the school area.
- 10. Parents will not be permitted to enter the school premises without the Parent I-Card.
- 11. Parents are expected to give an extra mask to the child, in case the mask being worn by the child is damaged or lost while in school.
- 12. Ensure that the child is commuting back and forth from school in a safe vehicle and that the driver is complying to the rules of the transport department.
- 13. Do fill the fitness Google form before the child starts for school from home (Only during hybrid classes).

EXPECTATIONS FROM TEACHERS

Teachers should...

- 1. embody the Christian Brother school philosophy in his/her professional relationships with the students, with each other and with all members of the school community.
- 2. avoid taking leave unless truly essential. Children suffer as substitutions cannot replace regular teachers.
- 3. place his/her professional expertise at the service of the students.
- 4. not accept any job of a remunerative character from any source other than the school or give private tuitions except with the permission of the Head of the school.
- 5. not enter into any monetary transaction with a student or parent or publisher or those desirous of seeking admissioninto the school.
- 6. listen to the pupil's point of view and try to understand their individual problems.
- 7. inform parents at an early stage if the child is involved in some form of substance abuse or persistent and /or majordisciplinary problem.
- 8. be available to the parents to talk over issues related to their child's behaviour (after having made an appointment).
- 9. avoid corporal punishment, which achieves nothing and brings in an atmosphere of fear.

10. keep updating herself/himself with new strategies to bring innovation in teaching.
